Costs, Fees, Discounts

Honey Creek Summer Day Camp allows you the flexibility to choose the DAYS of the summer that you wish to attend. The cost is **\$57.00/day** from 8am-6pm. Honey Creek students receive a 5% discount in the day camp only. No discounts for Specialty Camps or Before/After Care.

Specialty camps cost **\$280** for the full-day camp (8:30am-2pm); or **\$180** for half-day camp (8:30-11:30am or 12:30-3:30pm).

Before and After Care is available through our day camp for those participating in Specialty Camps. Daily costs are **\$5** for Early Drop-Off, **\$25** for 8am-12:30pm, **\$20** from 2-6pm, and **\$35** from 11:30am-6pm

A \$45.00 non-refundable enrollment fee is required for all campers and includes the cost of a Honey Creek Summer Camp t-shirt.
